1.) Holiness Is Really Important Because Holiness Is a <u>Distinction</u>.

- A.) Holiness implies Ownership.
- B.) At the heart of holiness is Relationship.
- C.) People and things were made holy through <u>covenants</u> and <u>rituals</u>.
- D.) Holiness is <u>contingent</u> and <u>dependent</u>.

2.) Holiness Is Really Important Because Holiness Is a Temptation.

- A.) Holiness tempts us:
 - i.) To think too <u>low</u> of others and too <u>high</u> of ourselves.
 - ii.) To Fall into <u>hypocrisy</u>.
- B.) The lesson for the priests was to:

- i.) Acknowledge their need
- ii.) Cultivate <u>humility</u>
- iii.) Honor the Lord

3.) Holiness Is Really Important Because Holiness Is a <u>Threat</u>.

Read Leviticus 6:24-30

- A.) God's Holiness Is a Threat to Sinful, Impure, Morally Culpable Creatures.
- B.) God Cannot, by his Very Nature, Tolerate Sin and Ungodliness.
