# Defining Justice: To Put Things Right

1.) The Case of the Blasphemer (v. 10-23)

verse I0, "Now the son of an Israelite woman, whose father was an Egyptian..."

verse I0, "...and this Israelite woman's son and a man of Israel fought each other in the camp."

B.) The Has Broken God's Law

*Verse II, "II And the Israelite woman's son blasphemed the name of the Lord and cursed..."* 

"You shall not take the name of the Lord your God in vain, for the Lord will not hold him guiltless who takes His name in vain." (Exodus 20:7)

Exodus 22:28, "**28** "You shall not revile God, nor curse a ruler of your people."

C.) Israel is <u>Unsure</u> What to Do With the Man.
